


Sacraments



Our Catholic Tradition

- In the Bible, God tells us about his great love for us. (ccc. 231)
- The Seven Sacraments are special signs and celebrations that Jesus gave his Church. The Sacraments allow us to share in the life and work of God. (ccc, 1131)
- The Church celebrates the Seven Sacraments as signs of God's love and life. (ccc, 1116)
- Grace means sharing in God's help and life so that we may grow as his children. (ccc, 1996)

Adam and Eve

Why did God's people need to be saved?

God created the first people to be like him. He made them happy and gave them a garden to care for. Then Adam and Eve made a bad choice. They disobeyed God and brought sin into the world. This is called **Original Sin**.

God Loves

Adam and Eve were no longer the kind of people God wanted them to be.

They broke their friendship with him. They suffered, and they missed God.

But God did not stop loving them. He wanted them to love him.



God's Promise

God said, "I love you always. I will show you how much I love you. I will send a Savior to bring you back to me." God kept this promise. He sent his Son, Jesus, to us. Jesus saves all people from sin. He is our Savior.

Jesus Lives

Some people did not believe that Jesus was God's Son. He was arrested and nailed to a Cross, where he died. His friends laid his body in a cave and blocked it with a large stone.

Some holy women went to visit the cave where Jesus was laid. The large stone was rolled away. The cave was empty. Two angels said, "Jesus is not here. He is risen from the dead!"

Then Jesus appeared to his followers.

Jesus Saves

Jesus' name means, "God saves." He died for all people to save them from their sins. Jesus gave his life so that people could have new life with God.


Jesus being raised from the dead to new life is called the **Resurrection**. He was raised to new life by God the Father through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus being raised to new life is a holy mystery. The Church celebrates the Resurrection in a special way on Easter.


Saint Josephine Bakhita, 1869–1947

She became a religious sister and helped prepare missionaries to go to Africa.





CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand Jesus as Savior Children in first grade will have difficulty understanding the idea that Jesus gave his life as a sacrifice for us. However, they can understand that Jesus loved us so much that he wanted to show us how to live even though it meant he would die. First-graders are just beginning to grasp the permanence

of death, making them particularly open to the Gospel message, which says that death could not hold Jesus, and he is risen.



CONSIDER THIS >>>


Have you ever thought about how the way you live your daily life is connected to Jesus' sacrifice?

It can be hard to grasp the importance of what Christ did for us, even for adults. It may seem impossible to live your life in a way that lives up to Jesus' sacrifice. Through our lives, our sufferings, our prayer and work, we are united with Christ. The important sacrifices that we make for each other and for God in our individual lives remind us of the importance of his sacrifice. "In a self-centered culture where people are taught to extend themselves only for something in return, the sacrifices each of us make, following the example of Jesus, who freely sacrificed his life in love for all, point to the reality and power of God's love for us" (USCCA, p. 221).
