




Our first parents, called Adam and Eve, in the Garden of Eden.

Free to Choose

What choice did Adam and Eve make?

God gives all people the freedom and ability to choose. The first book of the Bible tells a story about a choice made by Adam and Eve.



The Garden of Eden

God put Adam and Eve in a garden called Eden.
They had all they needed to live and be happy.

God told Adam and Eve that they were free to eat from all the trees in the garden, except one. God said, "When you eat from that tree, you will surely die."

Satan, a fallen angel and enemy of God and his People, disguised himself as a serpent and said to the woman, "This is not true. If you eat that fruit you will be like God."

Eve saw the tree's fruit and ate some. She gave some to Adam. He ate it, too.

Adam and Eve chose to do what they knew God did not want them to do. So God sent them away from the Garden of Eden.

How does Jesus save and lead us?

Catholic **Faith Words**

Savior a title for Jesus, who was sent into the world to save all people lost through sin and to lead them back to God the Father

God did not turn away from Adam and Eve. Instead, God promised to send a **Savior**. God promised that the Savior would lead all people back to friendship with him.

God kept his promise. He sent his own Son to be the Savior of all people. Jesus came into the world to save all people and lead them to God. Jesus wanted people to love God and to be happy with God again.



Jesus, the Good Shepherd

Jesus wanted the people to understand he is the Savior. Jesus told a story to show that he is like a shepherd and his followers are like sheep. Shepherds care for their sheep and lead them to grass and water. Shepherds make sure their sheep do not get lost.


Saint Cristóbal Magallanes Jara, 1869–1927

Saint Cristóbal Magallanes Jara grew up in Mexico. When he was a boy, he was a shepherd. Later, as a priest, he tried to be like Jesus, the Good Shepherd. He took care of the people in his village by building schools, starting a newspaper, and training men to become priests. He was arrested on his way to say Mass at a farm. Some people thought that he was trying to rebel against the government. He wasn't, but he was killed anyway. Before he died, Saint Cristóbal forgave the people who killed him.

CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand God's Plan Just as there is a purpose for everything God made, there is a plan for each of our lives. God gives each of us free will because actions cannot truly be good or loving if they are not done freely. As your child learns about God's plan for his or her life, he or she will also understand that there are times when we stray from God's plan. It's important for children to know that God will help them become what he made them to be and that God always provides us a way back to himself.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

When have you ever regretted something you've said or done?

At times, we all do things that are insensitive or downright hurtful. We sin and need to be redeemed. "In our churches, we behold Jesus nailed to the Cross, an image that reminds us of his painful sacrifice to bring about the forgiveness of all our sins and guilt. ... Each time we see the crucifix, we can reflect on the infinite mercy of God, who saves us through the reconciling act of Jesus" (USCCA, p. 243).

LET'S TALK >>>

- · Ask your child what he or she thinks it means to be responsible for your choices.
- Talk about how to react when someone thinks you have done something you didn't.

LET'S PRAY >>>

Saint Cristóbal, ask Jesus to watch over our family as a shepherd watches over his sheep. Amen.
