



The Ten Commandments

What can help me to make good choices?

God gave Moses and his Chosen People some laws to help them. These laws are called the Ten Commandments. God wants you to follow these laws, too. They help you make good choices about your friendship with God and others.

The Ten Commandments	How You Can Live Them
1 I am the LORD your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me.	Make God the most important thing in your life.
2 You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.	Use God's name in a reverent way.
3 Remember to keep holy the LORD's Day.	Attend Mass and rest on Sunday.
4 Honor your father and your mother.	Love and obey your parents and guardians.
5 You shall not kill.	Be kind to people and animals.
6 You shall not commit adultery.	Be respectful in the things you do with your body.
7 You shall not steal.	Don't take other people's things.
8 You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.	Tell the truth.
9 You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.	Keep your thoughts and words clean.
10 You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.	Be happy with the things you have; don't be jealous of what others have.

Jesus' Commands

Jesus learned and followed the Ten Commandments. When he grew up, Jesus taught a Commandment called the Great Commandment. It includes all the other Commandments and sums up God's laws.

God's Word

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." Luke 10:27

Jesus told many stories, or parables, to teach his followers that loving God means loving our neighbor. Here is a **parable** he told.


The Parable of the Good Samaritan

Once a man asked Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus told this story to answer him.

A man was going along a road alone. Robbers came and beat him up. They took everything he had and ran away, leaving him half-dead.

A Jewish priest was going down the same road. When he saw the man, he ignored him.

Later, someone who took care of the Temple came along. When he saw the man, he also ignored him.



Our Catholic Life

How can you be a good neighbor?

In the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus taught that neighbors aren't just the people who live next door to you. All people are neighbors. A neighbor can be someone who is in need, like the man who was robbed. A neighbor can be someone who helps, like the Samaritan.

> As followers of Christ, how are we to treat God? As neighbors, how are we to treat one another? The Great Commandment and Jesus' New Commandment tell us.

The Great Commandment

"Love God above all things, and love your neighbor as you love yourself."

The New Commandment

"Love one another as I have loved you."

Reach out to people who are lonely.

When someone asks you for forgiveness, give it gladly.

Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, 1207–1231

Saint Elizabeth was a princess of Hungary.


Jesus' command to love one another was very important to Elizabeth. She spent her entire life caring for people who were poor and suffering.

Elizabeth fed the hungry by giving them food at the castle gate. She sold her jewels and used the money to build hospitals. When her husband died, she was very sad. She worked hard to take care of her four children, but she kept helping the poor, too.

All: we praise and honor you.


Leader: You give us hope and life,



CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand the Great Commandment

Second-graders are just beginning to move out of the selfcentered tendencies of earlier childhood. But in a society so focused on individual comfort and fulfillment, it can be countercultural to speak of putting God over everything else or loving others as much as one loves one's self. Your child will need much guidance to understand how this translates into the practical decisions he or she makes every day. Much of this guidance will come in the form of the example you provide of caring for others and prioritizing God over other things.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

How do the rules in your home help you to love each other?

Children might think that rules restrict our freedom, but in actuality they lead us to reap the benefits of a deeper love. "... God has given us the virtue of love, the very love that he has for us. Our Lord asks us to accept this love and respond to him with it. Jesus made the love of God the first of the two greatest Commandments: 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind (Matthew 22:37)" (USCCA, p. 343).

LET'S TALK >>>

- Talk about family rules and why they are important.
- Ask your child what rules God gives us (Ten Commandments) and what Jesus commands us to do (to love one another as he has loved us).
