

Forgive One Another

How can we forgive others?

God our Father always forgives us if we are truly sorry. He gives us the Sacrament of Penance so we can always have his forgiveness. And Jesus wants us to forgive others in the same way that the Father forgives us!

Sometimes it is not easy to forgive others. You want to stay angry. But, Jesus asks that you make the choice to love the person that hurt you the way that God loves you.

The following stories are about children who made wrong choices.

A New Model

Ethan crept into Michael's room to see his brother's new model airplane. As he picked it up, he broke the wing. Michael walked in and became angry.

Ethan apologized, but Michael screamed, "I will never forgive you!"

"Well, I'll never talk to you again," said Ethan, as he stomped out of the room.

Putting Things Away

Chloe was supposed to put the balls away after recess. She forgot. The next day the balls were gone. Chloe told the teacher that it had been Alex's turn to put the balls away. Alex got in trouble because of Chloe's lie.

Jesus Asks Us to Forgive

Jesus wants you to ask forgiveness when you have done wrong. And Jesus asks you to be a forgiving person, too.

Our Catholic Life How do people forgive one another?

When someone has been unkind or unfair, you may be angry with that person. You may not want to talk to him or her. But Jesus asks you to do something very different. Jesus asks you to forgive.

Sometimes you are the person who does the hurting. You need to ask forgiveness if you have been unkind or unfair.

Show Forgiveness

- Be ready and willing to make things better.
- Listen to the person's apology.
- Say "I forgive you," and show it with a hug or a smile.
- Don't hold a grudge or pout.

Ask Forgiveness

- Imagine how it must feel for the other person.
- Say "I'm sorry," and mean it.
- Do whatever you can to make up for the wrong you did.
- Pray to God for help to make better choices.

Saint Jane Frances de Chantal, 1572-1641

Saint Jane Frances de Chantal is one of the few Saints who was a wife and mother. Jane was born in France. As she grew up, her parents helped her to grow in faith. When she was twenty years old, Jane married Christophe. The couple shared their love and their deep faith with their four children. One day, Christophe was killed in a hunting accident. Before he died, he forgave the man who shot him. Jane was heartbroken with grief. She struggled to forgive the man. She prayed to God to help her. Eventually, with God's help, she was able to forgive.

This week, your child met Saint Jane Frances de Chantal, a wife and mother who prayed to God to help her to forgive.

CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand God's Mercy God loves us no matter what. A second-grader's understanding of this will be influenced by his or her experience with love and forgiveness from significant adults. It's important that we not overreact to accidents (which are not the same as bad choices unless a bad choice led to the accident). It's also important that when children this age make a purposeful wrong choice, they be given a way to help repair the damage that was done. Finally, be sure to reassure your child of your love, even when he or she makes wrong choices.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

How important is being able to admit you are wrong?

As difficult as it may be to say those words, admitting that we are wrong is the necessary first step in the journey of forgiveness and reconciliation. "God's mercy makes possible the repentance of the sinner and the forgiveness of sin. Time and again in the Old Testament, the sins of the people are met with God's outreach of mercy and the invitation to be healed and return to a covenant relationship" (USCCA, p. 235).

LET'S TALK >>>


- Ask your child what Jesus teaches us about forgiveness.
