"I will offer a sacrifice of praise and call on the name of the LORD."



# God's Word

# What sacrifice did Jesus make for us?

Giving up something and making a sacrifice for someone else can be very difficult. Sacrifice takes love and courage. A rich young man found this out when he asked Jesus about life with God forever.

# The Greatest Gift

People sometimes make sacrifices, but Jesus chose to make the greatest sacrifice of all. Jesus' sacrifice is that he freely gave up his life on a Cross to save all people from the power of sin and everlasting death. He made this sacrifice so that you would have new life with God forever.

God the Father rewarded Jesus for his loving choice. Through God's loving power, Jesus overcame death and was raised to new life.



The Mass is a memorial celebration of Jesus' Death, Resurrection, and Ascension. Jesus' great sacrifice is celebrated at every Mass when we follow his command to do what he did when he shared a final meal with his disciples at the Last Supper.

# Liturgy of the Eucharist

# What will the gifts of bread and wine become during the Mass?

The second main part of the Mass is called the **Liturgy of the Eucharist**. Those gathered remember in a special way Jesus' Death, Resurrection, and Ascension.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins when members of the assembly bring forward the gifts of bread and wine. The people offer these gifts to God as a sign of their love. The priest prepares the gifts. He asks God to bless them. They will become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

Now, another important part of the celebration begins. The priest leads the assembly in prayer.

Priest: "The Lord be with you."

All: "And with your spirit."

Priest: "Lift up your hearts."

All: "We lift them up to the Lord."

Priest: "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God."

All: "It is right and just."

# The Eucharistic Prayer

The priest now begins the Eucharistic Prayer. He gives praise and thanks to God. He asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit. The priest repeats what Jesus said at the Last Supper:

**Priest:** FOR THIS IS MY BODY, WHICH WILL BE GIVEN UP FOR YOU . . .

FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD, ... WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME.

This is called the **consecration**. The bread and wine are now the Body and Blood of Christ.


The assembly prays the Mystery of Faith:

All: We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

The assembly recalls all that Jesus did and offers the Father the gift of his Son. The prayer ends with everyone saying or singing the "Great Amen."

How do you remember Jesus' sacrifice at Mass?

At Mass, the priest prays the Eucharistic Prayer. After he consecrates the bread and wine he invites everyone to say aloud what we believe about Jesus' sacrifice. He says the words *Mystery of Faith* to the assembly. We answer the priest by praying or singing a Mystery of Faith.

The Mystery of Faith is not a puzzle or a riddle. It is God's love for us, which is greater than we can ever understand completely. So, we simply say what we believe and thank God in our hearts.


## Blessed Imelda Lambertini, 1322–1333


Blessed Imelda Lambertini lived at a time when children couldn't receive Holy Communion until they were twelve. She was too young to receive Communion but she would pray at Mass and make a "spiritual communion." Jesus would come into her heart, but she still wanted to receive the Body of Christ in the Eucharist. One day, she was praying at Mass and a beautiful light with a host in it appeared over her head. Blessed Imelda is the patron Saint of children receiving their First Communion.



## CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

**How They Understand the Liturgy of the Eucharist** Many second-grade children have heard the words of the Liturgy of the Eucharist without fully realizing or understanding what they mean. It is hard for children this age to understand how and why Jesus gave himself as a sacrifice for all of humanity. The ritual form of this portion of the Mass will help your child to continue to reflect upon and grow in his or her understanding of Christ's sacrifice and its meaning for each of us.



## **CONSIDER THIS >>>**


What have you sacrificed for your children as a gift of love?

Becoming a parent sets one on a lifelong journey of sacrifice—sacrifices that come from love. This love gives us a glimpse of the love and sacrifice of Jesus, "In a self-centered culture where people are taught to extend themselves only for something in return, the sacrifices each of us make, following the example of Jesus, who freely sacrificed his life in love for all, point to the reality and power of God's love for us" (USCCA, p. 221).
