Being True to **Our Promises**

What does it mean to make a sacrifice?

Jesus made a promise to his Father. A promise can be easy or difficult to keep. You may need to give something up to keep a promise. Read this story about keeping promises.

One day, Lindsey was faced with a difficult choice. She was having fun with her friend when suddenly she stopped and looked at her watch.


"It's late. I have to go," Lindsey said.


sacrifice giving up something out of love for someone else or for the common good (the good of everyone). Jesus sacrificed his life for all people.

Lindsey gave up an afternoon with a friend because she made a promise. When you give up something or do something difficult out of love, it is called a **sacrifice**. It is not easy to make a sacrifice. It takes a lot of love and courage. You have to be unselfish when you make a sacrifice.

Jesus chose to make the greatest sacrifice of all. He did something that no one else could do. Jesus gave up his life so that people could be saved from the power of sin and everlasting death. He freely gave up his life so that all people could have new life with God forever.


Jesus' Resurrection

What does the Paschal Mystery mean?

Jesus' loving choice fulfilled God's plan to save his People. Through the work of the Holy Spirit, the Father raised Jesus from Death to new life. This is called the **Resurrection**. The Resurrection showed that God's power is stronger than death.



The Appearance to Mary Magdalene

Mary Magdalene went to Jesus' tomb, but she found it empty. She thought that people had taken Jesus' body away. Then angels spoke to her, and she heard someone call her name. It was Jesus!

When Mary first saw Jesus, she didn't recognize him. Thinking that he was the gardener, she asked where Jesus was. He said, "Mary!"

Then she knew it was Jesus. He told her to tell his friends that he was returning to the Father. Mary went to the disciples and said, "I have seen the Lord," and repeated what he told her.



Christ's Saving Work

Jesus' suffering, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension are called the **Paschal Mystery**. The word Paschal comes from a word that means "passover." Jesus died to save people from their sins at the time of year when members of the Jewish faith celebrate Passover. Jesus was raised from the dead and at the **Ascension** returned to Heaven to be with God the Father forever. He "passed over" from death to life so that all people can have new life with God in Heaven.

The Mass and the other Sacraments are ways that the Church lives out this great mystery. When you take part in the celebration of the Eucharist, you share in the saving power of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

How can your sacrifices help others?

When you make a sacrifice, you are offering a special gift. Most gifts involve time, talent, or treasure. In addition to helping others, gifts of sacrifice can help you feel good about yourself.

Gifts of Sacrifice

Gifts of time include paying attention to others.

- You give time when you play with a younger sister, brother, or neighbor.
- You can also visit elderly people in retirement centers.

A gift of treasure involves giving money to a worthy cause.

- You can give money to the Church or to other organizations that help people.
- You could donate some of your birthday money to the poor.

Gifts of talent include using your special abilities.

- You can give up some Saturday morning TV shows for choir practice.
- You could make cards for the elderly at a local senior center.

Saint Mary Magdalene, first century A.D.

Saint Mary Magdalene was sick. We don't know what was wrong, but Jesus made her well. She then became one of his followers. Mary was with Jesus as he preached about God's love. She stood at the foot of his Cross as he suffered and died. She went to Jesus' tomb on the first Easter morning and was surprised that the tomb was empty. Jesus appeared to her and told her to tell others that he had risen from the dead. Mary did as she was told. Many people believed in Jesus' Resurrection because of her.

This week, your child met Saint Mary Magdalene, who was one of the first people to tell others about Jesus' Resurrection.

CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand Jesus' Sacrifice It's difficult for third-graders to understand why it was necessary for Jesus to die. The suffering, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus Christ was in atonement for the sins of all mankind. The concept of atonement is still foreign to children this age, and can be difficult for many adults as well. For now, it is helpful for your child to understand that Jesus loved us so much that he was willing to die to show his love.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

What does it mean that we daily die and rise with Christ?

Life requires many "dyings." We die to being an adolescent, we die to being responsible only for ourselves, and we die to relationships that fail. Jesus' Death and Resurrection help us to understand that in every death, God can bring new life. "Faith in the resurrection of our bodies is inseparable from our faith in the Resurrection of Christ's body from the dead. He rose as our head, as the pattern of our rising, and as the life-giving source of our new life" (USCCA, 155).

LET'S TALK >>>

- Ask your child how making a sacrifice for someone else can help he or she feel good about themselves.
- Talk about a time you have made a sacrifice for someone else. How did that sacrifice show love?
