Many Choices How do you make good choices?

Your life is full of choices. Some don't make much of a difference, such as which color of shirt you wear on a Saturday.

Some choices do make a big difference, though. Sometimes you must choose between a bad thing and a good thing. If you are lucky, the choice is easy. Sometimes, the choice can be difficult.

Everyone needs help to make good choices. The Holy Spirit helps you. God's free and loving gift of **grace** in the Sacraments can help you. Parents, priests, and teachers can help you prepare for choices by giving you guidance and helping you form

> your conscience. God gave you your conscience to help you choose between right and wrong.

The Church Guides Choices

The Church helps us make good choices, too. We use the teachings of the Church to guide our choices. The Church teaches us to follow the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes. The Church tells us we must also follow its basic requirements, the **Precepts of the Church**, in order to deepen our relationship with God and the Church.



Precepts of the Church			
Precept	How Each Precept Guides You		
 Take part in Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. Keep these days holy and avoid unnecessary work. 	Makes sure that you take time to be with Jesus and your parish community, strengthens your faith, rests your body, and encourages you to enjoy the world God has given you		
2. Celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation at least once a year if there is serious sin.	Helps you look at your life to see how you need God's forgiveness and which actions you need to improve		
3. Receive Holy Communion at least once a year during Easter time.	Strengthens your faith and makes you one with Jesus		
4. Fast and abstain on days of penance.	Helps you share in the sacrifice of Jesus, train yourself spiritually, and experience the hunger of people who are poor		
5. Give your time, gifts, and money to support the Church.	Encourages you to support the Church and participate in her works

Saul and Jesus

Shortly after his Resurrection, Jesus returned to his Father in Heaven. A man named Saul began turning in followers of Jesus to the authorities.

One day, Saul was traveling between towns. A bright light flashed around him. He heard a voice say, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?"

Saul asked, "Who are you?"

The voice answered, "I am Jesus ... go into the city and you will be told what you must do."

Saul did as Jesus said. He was baptized and became a great Christian preacher and writer. He is now known as Saint Paul, his new name in Christ.

The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation

Like Saul, everyone makes wrong choices at times. The choice to disobey God on purpose is called **sin**. When you sin, you hurt your relationship with God and other people. But there are things you can do to help make things right again.

You can experience God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, also called confession. Through this Sacrament, God gives you a chance to take these actions through his Church:

- Look at what you have done.
- Say you are sorry, seek forgiveness, and receive absolution.
- Repair or make up for the wrong you have done, and change your behavior.



- Ask a parent or another trusted adult.
- **Receive** the Sacraments, and be strengthened to follow God's will.





People of Faith

Saint Pio (Padre Pio), 1887–1968

Saint Padre Pio was born in Italy. His parents were farmers. At age 15, he began studying to become a Capuchin priest. He took the name Pio in honor of Pope Saint Pius V. Padre Pio knew that confession was very important. He said that going to confession was like dusting the soul. He heard the confessions of people who traveled from all over. He helped them feel God's mercy and forgiveness. Padre Pio was known for having the stigmata, the visible wounds of Christ. He would tell people "Pray, hope, and don't worry."

Leader: Let us pray.


Bow your heads as the leader prays.



How They Understand Making Good Choices Third

graders often define good choices in terms of the parameters they have been given by people they trust. These parameters are often specific to place or situation. Because children this age depend a great deal on social expectations, it's important that this early conscience formation occur in family environments that are trustworthy and supportive of Catholic moral values.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

Who in your life do you trust to give you aood advice?

We are careful about who we trust to give us advice. We realize that even those we trust can be wrong because of our limitedness as human beings. "Wisdom enables us to see the world from God's viewpoint, which can help us come to grasp the purpose and plan of God. It grants us the long-range view of history, examining the present in the light of the past and the mystery of the future. It saves us from the illusion that the spirit of the times is our only guide" (USCCA, p. 208).

LET'S TALK >>>

- Ask your child to name one of the actions he or she can do to experience God's forgiveness.
- Talk about how you've experienced God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.
