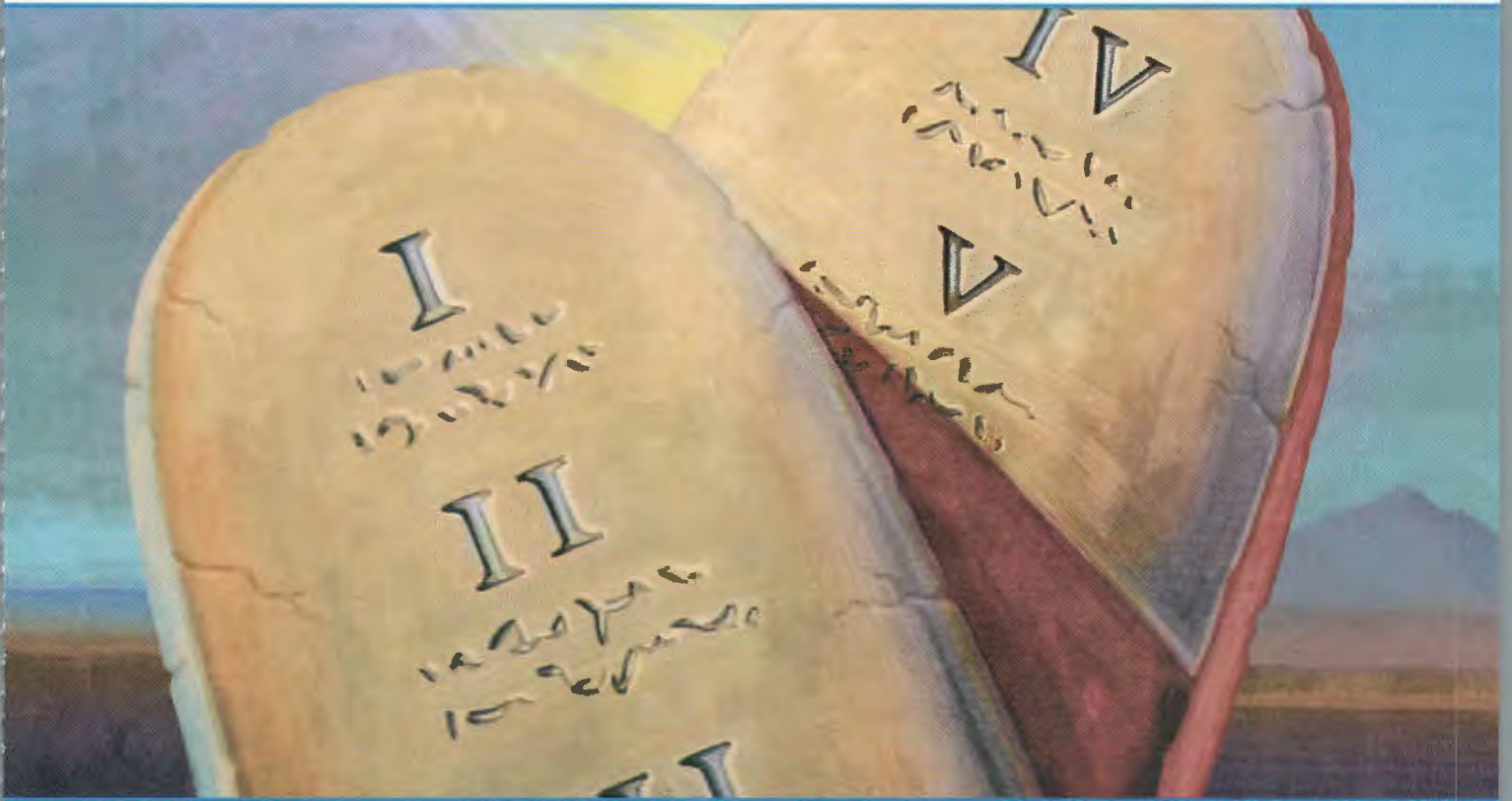

The First Sin

How did Adam and Eve's choice affect all of us?

For Adam and Eve, there was a time when every day was a good day. But one day, Satan, a fallen angel who was God's enemy, came to Eve in the form of a snake and tempted her. We learn from the Book of Genesis what Adam and Eve did. Genesis is the first book of the Bible. Together, the first five books of the Bible are called the Pentateuch. The five books are: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy.

In the Garden

In the Garden of Eden was one special tree that God told Adam and Eve not to touch. But Satan convinced Eve that if she and Adam ate the fruit of that tree, they could be more like God. Adam and Eve did as Satan said; but after they sinned, they felt ashamed. They learned how it felt to do something wrong.

Everything got harder for Adam and Eve. God sent them away from the garden. They had to work to find food and shelter. From then on, jealousy, sadness, and fighting were in the world. **Based on Genesis 3**

Consequences

Humans were created to share God's life and to be happy with God forever. By disobeying God, Adam and Eve broke their friendship with God. This sin of our first parents is called **Original Sin** because ever since that choice was made, sin has been present throughout the world. Original Sin affects every human. The inclination to sin, suffering, and death all came into the world as a result of Original Sin.

Even though God sent Adam and Eve away from the garden, he did not abandon them. He remained faithful and promised **salvation**. He wanted all humans to be free and faithful to him, so they could be happy forever.

The Book of Genesis then tells another important story, the story of Noah. The point of Noah's story is that even when people continued to sin and to disobey God, God was faithful.

After a long time, God called a man named Abram to help humans remain faithful.

Abram's Call and Journey

The LORD called Abram, promising to bless him and make of him a great nation. Abram took his wife, Sarai, his brother's son Lot, and their possessions on the long journey to the new land as God directed.

Abram and his family were never alone on their difficult journey. They knew that God was always with them. Every time Abram reached a stop on the journey, he built an altar of thanksgiving to the LORD. **Based on Genesis 12:1-8**

God's Promise

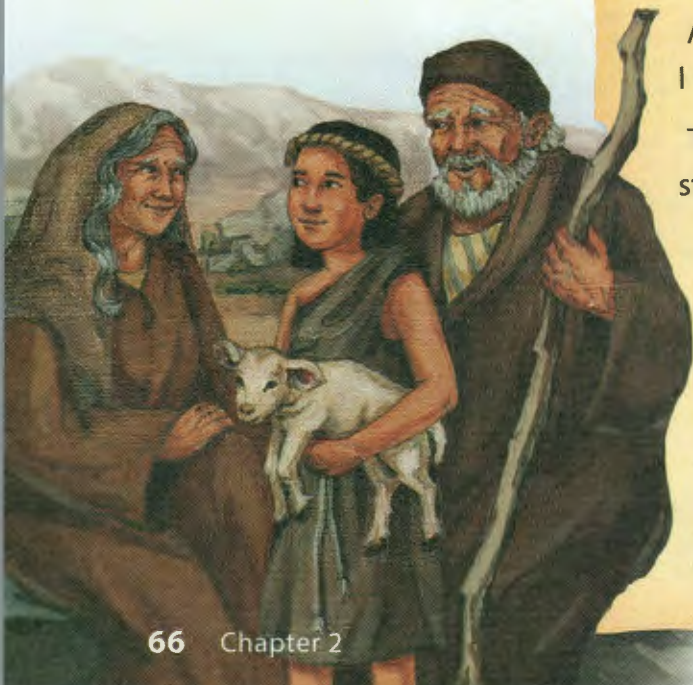
Many years later, after Abram had settled in the land of Canaan, the LORD spoke again to him, saying, "Don't be afraid! I will protect and reward you."

Abram replied, "LORD, you have given me everything I could ask for, except children."

The LORD told Abram, "Look at the sky and count the stars. That is how many descendants you will have."

God spoke to Abram again. God made a covenant with Abram and his descendants for all time. God told Abram, "To your descendants I give this land . . . I am making you the father of a multitude of nations." The land of Canaan would belong to Abram and his descendants forever, and these people would be God's people.

God's Covenant with Abraham

God revealed his plan to Abram in a new way by making a **covenant**, or sacred promise or agreement, with him. As a sign of the covenant, God changed the names of Abram and Sarai to Abraham and Sarah. Soon after that, even though Sarah was old, she had a son, whom the couple named Isaac.

Abraham and Sarah never turned away from God. Like Abraham and Sarah, you are **faithful** to God every time you obey his laws and make loving choices.

Abraham is considered an ancestor in faith of Christianity, Judaism, and Islam. These religions see their origins in Abraham's free response to God's revelation that he was the one God Abraham should believe in and follow.

In prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, we are in the presence of Christ, who remained faithful to God the Father and fulfilled the covenant.

How do you remain faithful?

Often we ask God for help and guidance. Sometimes his help does not come as quickly as we would like. Or it may not be the help we expect. It may be difficult to be faithful. But, we continue to pray and trust that God will give us the help we need to get through whatever we face.

Abraham and Sarah prayed and waited for many years before they had their first child. They were shocked to learn they would have a child so late in life. But, their son, Isaac, arrived according to the timing of God's plan.

At times, God's answer is not easy to see. Many times when you ask for his help, God gives you the ability to help yourself. Jessica learns this in the following situation.

After two months, Jessica had enough money to buy the video game.

Saint Bridget of Sweden, ~1303–1373

Saint Bridget was born to one of the wealthiest landowners in all of Sweden. In fact, her family was related to the king. Her parents made sure that she was taught religion. By the time she was seven, she was known to have religious dreams, or visions, of Jesus and the Holy Family. For an entire year, she prayed fifteen Our Fathers and fifteen Hail Marys every day, along with other prayers Jesus taught her.

CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand God's Faithfulness As he or she grows in social skills and awareness, your child has deeper friendships than before. Your child understands that trust and loyalty are essential to being in relationship with someone else. This provides a natural context in which to learn about God's covenants and his faithfulness in keeping his promises—even when we as human beings do not always live up to our commitments to God.



CONSIDER THIS >>>


How can making good choices make you happy?


God created us to live in happiness with him forever. When we sin, we turn away from God and our relationship with him. As Catholics, we realize that “though venial sin does not completely destroy the love we need for eternal happiness, it weakens that love and impedes our progress in the practice of virtue and the moral good. Thus, over time, it can have serious consequences” (*USCCA, p. 313*).

- Ask your child to tell you about God's covenant with his People and why it was needed.
- Talk with each other about what it means to be trustworthy and loyal to God and one another.
