



Jesus Chooses a Leader

Whom did Jesus choose as the leader of the Apostles?

We have many teachers who help us learn important lessons. Our parents are our first teachers, and the Church is our most important teacher. The Church's authority, or power to teach, was given by Jesus and is guided by the Holy Spirit. Here is a Gospel passage about the beginnings of the Church's authority to teach.




You Are the Messiah!

Now Jesus and his disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi. Along the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Messiah." Then [Jesus] warned them not to tell anyone about him. Mark 8:27–30

Peter believed in Jesus and said so. Jesus gave Peter and the other Apostles a share in the authority he had from his Father. Then Jesus sent them out to preach, teach, forgive, and heal in his name.

If Jesus asked you the same question he asked Peter, what would you say?

Peter and Jesus

Peter made some mistakes along the way. Much later, at the time of Jesus' crucifixion, Peter and the other disciples were very much afraid. In fact, the night before Jesus died, Peter denied three times that he had ever known Jesus. Afterward, he was ashamed of himself and cried bitterly.

But Jesus never lost faith in Peter. After Jesus' Death and Resurrection, Jesus was talking to Peter and the other disciples on the shore of a lake. Jesus asked three times whether Peter loved him. Of course, Peter said that he did. Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs. Feed my sheep." (See John 21:15–17.)

In spite of Peter's earlier denials, Jesus made Peter the chief shepherd of all his flock. When he became the leader, Peter made good decisions for the members of the Church.

The Church and You

What is your role as a member of the Church?

After Jesus ascended into Heaven, Peter and the Apostles were afraid. Then at Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came and gave them courage to preach the Good News.

The Apostles, with Peter as their head, were the first leaders of the Church. Jesus founded the Church on the Apostles. He gave them the authority to teach and lead his followers. Today, the chief teachers in the Church are the Pope and the bishops, the successors of the Apostles. Their teaching office is called the **Magisterium**. They have the teaching authority to interpret the Word of God found in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition. This is called magisterial authority, and goes back to the authority Christ first gave to the Apostles. The Holy Spirit works through the Church's teachers to keep the whole Church faithful to the teachings of Jesus.

The Church's mission to share the true message of Jesus is not left to the Pope and bishops alone. All members of the Body of Christ have a duty to learn Jesus' message as the Church interprets it and to share it with others. As you do this, you will grow in your love of God and neighbor.

Rules for Living

Some of the responsibilities of members of the Catholic Church are summed up in the **Precepts of the Church**. The Church's leaders developed these rules and requirements to show you the minimum you should do to live morally and faithfully. As a Catholic, you have a duty to live according to the teachings and Precepts of the Church.

Precepts of the Church

- Take part in the Mass on Sundays and holy days.
 Keep these days holy and avoid unnecessary work.
- 2. Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year if you have committed a serious sin.
- **3.** Receive Holy Communion at least once a year during Easter time.
- 4. Observe days of fasting and abstinence.
- **5.** Give your time, gifts, and money to support the Church.

When each person gives time, gifts, or money, the Church can provide for the needs of her members and can grow in helping meet the needs of others as well.


Ways to Support Your Parish


People of Faith

Saint Mary Magdalen Postel, 1756-1846

Saint Mary Magdalen Postel was educated in a Benedictine convent. At eighteen she opened a school for girls in France. It was just before the French Revolution. During the revolution, her school was closed. At that time, Mary Magdalen helped protect fugitive priests. She knew the importance of teaching people about the faith. She wanted everyone to know what the Church teaches. So after the revolution ended, she continued to work in the field of religious education.

Let Us Pray

Prayer of Intercession

In an intercession, we ask God to act in some way in the lives of others. This prayer follows the order of the Prayer of the Faithful, which we pray at Mass.

Gather and begin with the Sign of the Cross.

Leader: We gather, knowing that God hears us when we pray.

Reader 1: For our Church, that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide her as she teaches the truth revealed by Jesus, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader 2: For those in need, that they will experience our care as we live the Beatitudes, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader 3: For each person in our community, that the Great Commandment guides us, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: For what else shall we pray?

CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand Church Teaching For most fourthgraders, the experience of the teaching Church is limited to their own parish or school; for example, the things they learn in faith formation and hear in the Mass. However, your child is likely growing in his or her ability to perceive the larger worldwide Church and to understand the role of the bishops and Pope. Your child's respect for these leaders will be influenced by the respect shown by adults around them.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

Do you recall when you first realized that you didn't have all the answers?

As we grow wiser, we realize we are limited in our understanding. The Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, brings us the fullness of truth. As Catholics, we know the "entire community of Christians received the Apostles' proclamation of the Gospel, and so the church in her entirety is called 'apostolic.' Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the church as a whole remains and will always remain faithful to the teaching of the Apostles" (USCCA, p. 132).
