Honor and Respect

What does the Fourth Commandment require?

It would be hard to imagine our lives without our families. The love of our parents, grandparents, aunts, and uncles helps us to feel cared for and valued. God created humans to live in families. God wants families to be strong, to protect one another, and to live in peace and love.

The Fourth, Sixth, and Ninth Commandments provide basic laws about family love and respect. The Fourth Commandment is this: Honor your father and mother. Jesus is the perfect example for living out this Commandment.

The Boy Jesus and His Family

When Jesus was twelve, he went to Jerusalem with his family to celebrate Passover. As Mary and Joseph were returning home, they realized that Jesus was not with them. They finally found him talking with the teachers in the Temple. Mary told Jesus how worried they had been, and Jesus returned to Nazareth with his parents.

Jesus was obedient as he grew in wisdom and age. His actions were pleasing to God and to all who knew him.

Living the Fourth Commandment

The Fourth Commandment teaches you to honor your parents and guardians. You honor them when you

- listen to and obey them in all that is good.
- show gratitude for all that they do for you.
- respect and care for them as they grow older.
- respect people in authority.

Parents and guardians are to provide for your needs, serve as good role models, love you, and share their faith with you. This sharing makes the family a domestic Church, where we first learn about loving others and following Christ. Parents and guardians also encourage you to grow in faith by sharing their own faith and teaching the **Cardinal Virtues**, good habits that help us live as children of God. They help you make good choices and figure out your vocation.


Cardinal Virtues the four principal moral virtues— prudence, temperance, justice, and fortitude—that help us live as children of God and from which the other moral virtues flow. We strengthen these good habits through God's grace and our own efforts.

temperance the Cardinal Virtue that helps us use moderation, be disciplined, and have self-control

fortitude the Cardinal Virtue that helps you show courage, have strength to get through difficult times, and not give up on doing good

modesty a moral virtue and one of the Fruits of the Holy Spirit that helps us dress, talk, and move in appropriate ways

chastity a moral virtue and one of the Fruits of the Holy Spirit that helps us to act and think in ways that are appropriate and pure

Faithful Love

What do the Commandments teach about love?

The Sixth Commandment is: You shall not commit adultery. The Ninth Commandment is: You shall not covet your neighbor's wife. These Commandments are about the faithful love and commitment between husband and wife.

When a man and woman marry, they make solemn promises to or before God, called vows. They promise to love and honor each other always and to welcome the gift of children.

Part of being faithful is respecting your vows and those of other married couples. Married couples should not act in ways that would weaken their marriage. Adultery means being unfaithful to these vows. The grace of the Sacrament of Matrimony strengthens the couple to be faithful and true.

Virtues and You

The Sixth and Ninth Commandments apply to everyone. You can live out these Commandments by keeping promises to family, friends, and God.

The four Cardinal Virtues—prudence, temperance, justice, and fortitude—help us to act wisely, use self-control, give others their due, stand strong, and be disciplined in our thoughts and actions.


Temperance helps us to practice **modesty** and **chastity**. You can dress, talk, and move in ways that honor your own dignity and that of others. You can respect that the differences between males and females are gifts from God.

God's Love Strengthens

Sometimes it is hard for families to live as God intends.

Arguments, hurts, and disappointments can keep families from being signs of God's love. Parents and children sometimes hurt one another. Some families are hurt through separation, divorce, or even death.

But God continues to love all families and to help them grow stronger. Every time families are signs of love, they reflect the love that exists within the Holy Trinity.

God asks you to show his love to your family at all times. This is not always easy, but keeping the Fourth, Sixth, and Ninth Commandments will help you.





All: Hear us, O Lord.


Leader: Let us pray.

CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand Family Love Fourth-graders usually have a very strong love for their parents. If they live with both parents, they can often pick up on the quality of their mom and dad's relationship with one another. One area in which they often struggle is in their relationship with siblings. Developmental differences, as well as limited space and attention, can cause rivalries between brothers and sisters.

When children understand that the family is like a school where we learn to love each other, they can rise to meet these challenges with God's help.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

How has your understanding of what it means to honor your parents changed?

As our parents age, we have an opportunity to show what they taught us about love. As Catholics, we know that "while adult children may sometimes experience a strain between raising their own children and caring for their parents, they must do what they can to help their parents.... While it is right for society to help care for the elderly, the family remains the rightful source of support" (USCCA, pp. 377-378).
