

Live in the Truth




Leader: Your words, O Lord, are precious and true.

Witness to the Truth

How do people show that they value truth?

Saint Thomas More, an important official in England in the sixteenth century, was imprisoned for refusing to tell a lie.

Saint Thomas More

Saint Thomas had an important decision to make. In a letter to his daughter, he discussed his dilemma.

My dearest Meg,

Your father greets you with all his affection but not much hope. The dilemma I face will not soon go away.

I have been imprisoned now for some months.

All I have to do to be set free is to take the Oath of Supremacy. But how can I? If I take the oath, I will be saying that Henry VIII is the supreme head of the Catholic Church in England. You know that my Catholic faith is strong, and I believe that the Pope is the true head of the Catholic Church.

King Henry is angry. He is afraid that if I go against him, other people will follow my example. I am being forced to make a choice: be honest and be killed, or tell a lie and live.

Saint Thomas More chose to remain true to his beliefs and speak the truth. As a result, the king had him killed, but the Catholic Church named him a Saint. Many Saints have suffered torture and death for the sake of their faith. A person who stays faithful to Christ and suffers and dies rather than denying the truth is called a martyr. Martyrs live the truth by backing up their words with actions.

Catholic Faith Words

martyr a person who gives up his or her life to witness to the truth of Christ and the faith. The word martyr means "witness."

Jean Donovan was an American missionary martyr. She was killed with three other women in 1980, while working as part of a Diocesan Mission Project in El Salvador.

The Eighth Commandment


What does the Eighth Commandment call you to do?

God is the source of all truth. His Word and his law call people to live in the truth. The Eighth Commandment says this: You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

The Eighth Commandment forbids lying, or purposely not telling the truth. Lying can take many forms. If a person lies in court when under oath, he or she commits perjury, or false witness. Gossip is talking about another person behind his or her back. Gossip may or may not be a lie, but all gossip can harm the good reputation of another person.

All lies are unjust and unloving. All require reparation, or repair. Reparation may be as simple as an apology, or it may take more work, such as trying to help a person get back the reputation you have hurt.

Jesus Is the Truth

Living in the spirit of the Eighth Commandment is more than not lying. You must choose to act with **prudence** and make correct decisions on what is right and good. When you are truthful, you are living as a follower of Jesus, who always told the truth.



The Truth Will Set You Free

[Jesus said] "If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free. . . . I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." John 8:31–32, 14:6

People trusted what Jesus did and said. When you are truthful, people trust you. When you promise to tell the truth, you have a special duty. Let your "yes" mean "yes" and your "no" mean "no." Telling the truth will set you free to follow Jesus and to live in love.

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
People of Faith

Saint Joan of Arc, 1412-1431

It isn't always easy to tell the truth. Saint Joan of Arc became a martyr because she told the truth. Joan was a teenager when she had visions and heard voices. They told her to lead an army to fight for truth and save France from invaders. She bravely told the truth about her visions and voices and saved France in many battles. However, Joan was accused of being against the Church and of being a witch. She was burned at the stake. Many books and movies have been written about her.

Discuss: Talk about a time when you told the truth even though it was difficult.

CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand Telling the Truth Your child is probably a concrete thinker who understands cause and effect. Unlike preschoolers, children this age know that the truth doesn't change just because we want it to. They also know that adults don't know everything, and that sometimes we can be fooled. It's important for children to see the connection between truth, trust, and relationship. We cannot really be close to people if we tell them lies, no matter how small the lies, because relationship implies trust.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

How important is truth in your relationships?

Most of us expect honesty in our relationships even if we do not always welcome it. Truth is central to our relationship with God. As Catholics, we know that "God is the source of truth. Jesus not only taught the truth; he also said, 'I am the truth' (cf. John 14:6). The Hebrew word for truth, emeth, refers to truth in words and truthfulness in deeds. Jesus both personalized truth and spoke nothing but the truth" (USCCA, p. 431).

- Ask your child to explain the Eighth Commandment.
- Share a time when you had to decide to lie or tell the truth, or when someone else lied to you. How did it feel? What did you do?
