

Some people long for things that others take for granted. Some long for things they really don't need. Still others long for friends, or family, or a closeness in relationships. Read this passage to discover what is more important to Jesus.



Martha and Mary


[Jesus] entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary [who] sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak.

Martha, burdened with so much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me."

The Lord said to her..."Martha...you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." Luke 10:38-42

Both Martha and Mary welcomed Jesus, but Mary showed she was looking for something more.


The Gift of Longing

People long for-hope for, desire, really want—all kinds of things. Some of these things are important, and some are not. Both Martha and Mary welcomed Jesus into their home. Martha provided hospitality and served her guest. Mary, however, longed for something more. She wanted to connect with Jesus. What a wonderful gift she received as she listened to Jesus' teaching.

There are many layers of longing in the world. You may long for things, or for the right words to say. You may long to be loved and accepted by others. You may long for good health, or to win a game, or to be chosen for a special honor. All of your longings are part of your desire to be truly happy.

Longing is actually a gift in itself. It is planted inside you by God. God wants you to find your way home to him at the end of your life on Earth. Religion is the way you express your longing for God. Religion gives you a language to express your thoughts and feelings about God.

Jesus knows our longings and offers us all we need, as we learn in this account from the Gospel according to John.





The Samaritan Woman

A woman of Samaria, tired and hot, trudged along with her water jars. At the well, she noticed a Jewish stranger. Contrary to custom, the man spoke directly to her, asking for a drink. He then said, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

She asked where she could get this "living water." The stranger, who was Jesus, said he did not mean ordinary water. The water he spoke of was God, who wants everyone to worship him in the Spirit and in truth. The woman said, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Anointed; when he comes, he will tell us everything." Jesus answered, "I am he, the one who is speaking with you."

God Satisfies You

When you long for God, only the living water of his grace will satisfy you. Jesus knows that deep in the human heart is a longing that only God can fill. The desire for God is more powerful than your thirst for water on a hot day. The Samaritan woman's response to Jesus shows the beginning of her faith in him as the Messiah.

Faith is a gift from God that enables you to believe and trust in God and the things he has revealed to us, even though you cannot see him. Faith is also a human action by which you choose to respond to God's presence in your life. You received this gift in the Sacrament of Baptism. In the waters of Baptism, you became a child of God and a member of the Body of Christ.

Helping Faith Grow

Baptism is the beginning of your faith journey. Your faith continues to grow and develop. In this life, you come to know God through creation, through the Bible, and, most of all, through Jesus. You are helped by your parents and the Church community. Your faith grows through praying, reading Scripture, and being active in your parish. Like the Samaritan woman, you are called to share your growing faith and joy with others.



How do you seek God?

We help satisfy our longing for God by searching for him in prayer and Scripture. If we are willing to listen, God will speak to us and help us follow him.

No matter where or when you decide to pray or read the Bible, your effort will bring you closer to God. However, some places help you be a better listener.

Church

The parish church is the house of God. Even when the community is not worshipping there, Christ is present. Go there and tell him everything in your heart. Then be still and listen for his answer.

Outdoors

Jesus often prayed outdoors. There, he felt close to his Father, the Creator of all. Being out in the natural world can lead you to a spirit of grateful praise.

Saint Augustine, 354-430

Augustine had a Christian mother and a pagan father. His mother wanted him to be baptized, but he studied many other ideas before he became a Christian. He became a monk and a priest and later was the bishop of Hippo, a city near his hometown in North Africa. Saint Augustine was a great teacher and writer. He tells us that everyone longs to love God, and we will never be happy until we know God. One of his prayers to God begins, "You have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."


How many people do you know who say they are spiritual but not religious?

In our culture today, some people have negative feelings about institutions, including organized religion. Some argue that the time, money, and effort it takes to maintain the institution can minimize the mission of the institution. As Catholics, we know that "there is no doubt that the Church is called to be a community of love in the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The risen Jesus himself presented a model of Church leadership based in love when he solicited three affirmations of love from Peter (cf. Jn 21:15-17). At the same time, though, the Church has many structures that are needed to build up the bond of love" (USCCA p. 121).
