God Gives Wisdom

What is wisdom?


God is the source of all wisdom. Wisdom is a gift from God that helps us understand his purpose and plan for our lives. Wisdom helps us know what will make us truly happy. Here is the story of a Saint who showed wisdom.

Saint Hildegard of Bingen

Saint Hildegard is an example of a person who used wisdom in the correct way: to glorify God. When she was very young, Hildegard began having visions of light. These visions helped her understand Scripture and other holy writings. A voice told her to share these insights, but she felt unworthy to do so. Eventually, she did write about the visions as a way to lead others to God.


Hildegard was interested in many topics, and she shared her knowledge of them. She wrote about virtues and sins, the nature of the universe, and the history of salvation. She studied the use of plants for medicines and wrote two medical books to share what she had learned.

Hildegard thought music was the best way to honor God, and even better than words for revealing wisdom. She composed over seventy songs, and wrote a play, poems, and letters.

Wisdom Writing in the Bible

Wisdom was greatly admired by the people of Israel. They believed that if you did what was right, you would prosper; but if you did what was foolish or evil, you would suffer. Several books of the Old Testament contain wisdom writings of the people of Israel: Psalms, Job, Proverbs, Sirach, Ecclesiastes, and Wisdom.

Guides for Living

These books in the Bible offer guides for living. The Book of Proverbs is filled with teachings and short sayings that reflect the traditional insights of the people of Israel. You may have heard some of these proverbs.

Whoever meddles in the quarrel of another is one who grabs a passing dog by the ears. Proverbs 26:17

The way of fools is right in their own eyes, but those who listen to advice are the wise. Proverbs 12:15

Rich and poor have a common bond: the LORD is the maker of them all. Proverbs 22:2

The Wisdom Books

How is God's wisdom shown by Solomon and Job?

The Book of Wisdom, often called the Book of Solomon, teaches in a different way. It is a narrative about the importance of acting wisely.

Solomon, the son of King David, succeeded his father as king. Solomon built a Temple in Jerusalem to give the people of Israel a place where they could worship the one true God. However, Solomon is remembered even more for his wisdom.



Solomon's Request


Solomon asked for God's help. "I am young," he said. "So that I may serve you well, LORD, give me an understanding heart to judge your people and to know right from wrong."

God approved Solomon's request and replied, "Because you have not asked for wealth and power over your enemies, I will grant your request. I give you the wisest heart that has ever been or will ever be, and I will give you wealth, honor, and long life besides." Based on 1 Kings 3:4–14

Solomon knew that true wisdom comes from more than human insight. God's laws revealed his purpose and plan. Observing God's laws led to wisdom. Because of his faith, Solomon knew that true human wisdom is a participation in God's own wisdom and goodness.

1 Kings 6-8 describes the building of King Solomon's Temple to God. At its dedication, Solomon said, "I have built this house for the name of the LORD, the God of Israel" (1 Kings 8:20).



The Books of Wisdom and Proverbs primarily hand down traditional wisdom. Other books, like the Book of Job, challenge popular beliefs. Job was depressed. He was a very good man, yet he was suffering. Some friends told him that his troubles must be his punishment for displeasing God. But Job knew that he was good and demanded to talk to God directly.

God spoke to Job. Revealing all of his creative power and might, he reminded Job of who God is. A terrified Job responded this way:



The Story of Job

I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be hindered...

I have spoken but did not understand; things too marvelous for me, which I did not know. ...

By hearsay I had heard of you, but now my eye has seen you.

Therefore I disown what I have said, and repent in dust and ashes.

God told Job's friends that they were wrong in what they told Job. He restored Job's health and his prosperity. Based on Job 42:2-6

How can you make wise decisions?

You need wisdom when you make important decisions. Before making those important decisions, take time to look for God's wisdom in what you are going to do.

Here are some simple steps you can follow to help you make wise decisions.

- **1.** Find a place where you can pray without distractions.
- **2.** Pray to the Holy Spirit for wisdom and the ability to discover God's will.
- 3. Ask yourself the following questions:
 - Am I choosing between two things or among many things?
 - How would each decision help me trust God and obey his laws?
 - How would each decision make it harder for me to trust God and obey his laws?

- **4.** Try to remember a Bible passage in which a similar decision had to be made. Think about what happened in the passage.
 - What passage did you choose?
 - How did the passage end?
- **5.** If you are still not sure of the choice you should make, discuss the situation with a trusted adult, such as a parent or relative, a priest or parish minister, or a teacher.
- **6.** After making your decision, continue to pray for guidance from the Holy Spirit.




People of Faith

Saint Thomas Aquinas, 1225 -1274

When Saint Thomas Aquinas was a student at the University of Paris in France, the other students called him "the dumb ox" because he was big and didn't talk much. But Thomas ended up being one of the smartest and wisest men in the history of the Church. He wrote a three-part study of Catholic teaching called the *Summa Theologica*. He believed we become wise by the things we learn, but also through our faith in God. Saint Thomas also was a university teacher and a consultant to the Pope. Even today, people study his writings and teaching.




What is the difference between wise and smart?

Most of us know someone who is "book smart" but does not seem to be wise. Wisdom is a Gift of the Holy Spirit. As Catholics, we know wisdom "enables us to see the world from God's viewpoint, which can help us come to grasp with the purpose and plan of God. It grants us the long-range view of history, examining the present in light of the past and the mystery of the future. It saves us from the illusion that the spirit of the times is our only guide" (USCCA, p. 208).
