In this chapter you will learn about God's plan in sending the Holy Spirit. You will also discover the unique and powerful ways the Holy Spirit is present in the Church.


The web below shows three symbols of the Holy Spirit. On the lines below each symbol, explain why it could be associated with the Holy Spirit.



A Promise Kept

Why did God send the Holy Spirit to us?

It's hard when you can't be with a close friend anymore. He or she might have moved away, or you might be going to a new school. You miss your friend, and things you do are different because that person isn't there. You might feel lonely, wondering why people don't understand you and what's important to you.

Jesus knew his disciples would miss him when he was no longer with them. His followers were going to feel lost without him. His Death would break their hearts. His Resurrection might certainly confuse them. His return to the Father in Heaven would definitely challenge them.

How could the Apostles continue the work they had done with Jesus when he was no longer with them?


Always with Them

Jesus promised his Apostles he wouldn't stop being with them. In fact, he promised them that he would always be with them through an **Advocate**, the Holy Spirit. An advocate is someone who speaks on your behalf.

So Jesus said to his disciples at the Last Supper, "'If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, which the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows it. But you know it, because it remains with you, and will be in you." John 14:15–17


The Soul of the Church



How does the Holy Spirit help us in ways that no one else can?

We May Seem Alone

Often, the support and strength of friends helps us through difficult times. There are times, however, when we must face something all on our own. We might be surrounded by our friends, and they might even offer their help and support. But in the end, whatever it is we must face, we need to do it on our own.

Imagine an Olympic gymnast, about to begin his routine on the rings. He has trained for years to get to this point in his athletic career. He knows that his family and friends are in the arena, watching and sending good thoughts his way. He hears the whistles and cheers of fans he has never met. He feels the support of his coach and teammates. At the same time, he will be alone when he reaches for the rings and performs his routine. He will have to remember everything he has learned in practice and previous meets, and apply all his mental and physical strength to the routine. No one else can do it for him.

The Scripture passage below tells of how, as Jesus prepared himself for the Cross, his friends fell asleep. Twice he returned to find them sleeping and unaware of his pain. How must Jesus have felt?

Have you ever had to do something you knew would be difficult—but you also knew that it was important that you do it? Jesus teaches, "... how much more will the Father in heaven give the holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (Luke 11:13).

Scripture

"Then Jesus came with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, 'Sit here while I go over there and pray."

He asked his three friends to sit up and wait. He probably wanted them to be there for him, to support him. Then he said to them, 'My soul' is sorrowful, even to death.'

Then, he moved farther into the garden where they could not see him. He addressed his heavenly Father in prayer, asking that the Cross be taken from him, if possible. Jesus prayed, 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will.'"

G Go to the Source

For more on the Last Supper, read Matthew 26:26–29, Mark 14:22–25, and John 13:1–17.

As you have probably discovered already, none of us can avoid pain and difficulties in life. We will have challenges in our lives that we must face on our own. But we will have the help and special comfort of the Holy Spirit as we face these trials and confront these challenges.

The **Saints** often prayed to God for help, and the prayers they prayed still help people pray effectively today. The Saints poured out their hearts for help from above. We, too, are sure that the Holy Spirit will personally help us. And we call on the Saints to pray for us, asking for their **intercession** on our behalf.



The Holy Spirit, Guide

How does the Holy Spirit help the Church?

A garden grows because someone takes the time and effort to water and weed it. Without weeding, the plants will be choked by unhealthy growth. Without water, the plants in the garden will wither and die.

Similarly, when we raise our minds and hearts to God—which is what prayer is—we cultivate our spiritual garden. Requesting bad things from God will produce in us a spiritual garden full of weeds. Neglecting the time and effort for prayer will produce a withered spiritual garden.



Guidance

We need someone to guide us through life's questions and help us live for God. That guide is the Holy Spirit. He works through the Church and often through the people in our lives.

The Holy Spirit acts through the Church to teach and form us as disciples, guiding the Church in her interpretation of God's Word in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition.

This Sacred Tradition is our religious heritage. Sacred Tradition is God's Word to the Church, safeguarded by the Apostles and their successors, the bishops, and handed down verbally—in her Creeds, Sacraments, and other teachings—to future generations. This Sacred Tradition enriches our personal prayer and the prayer life of the Catholic Church, so that we raise our minds and hearts to God in holy and effective ways.

A Guide to Prayer

Just like you talk to your friends in different ways depending upon what you have to share, you can talk to God in different ways, too. The Holy Spirit is with you when you pray, guiding you in prayer as you grow in faith. Because you have different needs and different experiences during life, the Holy Spirit gives you a variety of ways to pray.

The Holy Spirit also teaches you to pray. He does this by helping different generations of Church leaders and Catholics pass on the truth of Jesus through the Church's Seven Sacraments, the Creeds, teachings,

and devotional practices such as praying the Rosary or the Liturgy of the Hours.

When you pray, is it mostly asking God for something, or do you just talk to God as a friend who listens?

The Ways We Pray

Prayers of **blessing and adoration** bless God for being the source of all that is good and show that we need him. We respond to God's gifts and give respect to God by honoring his greatness.

Prayers of **praise** give honor to God for being who he is. We give him glory as his children not for what he does, but simply because he is.

Prayers of **petition** ask God for something we need for ourselves. We might ask for God's mercy, forgiveness, and guidance.

Prayers of **intercession** ask God for something on behalf of another person. We use intercessory prayer on behalf of others as Jesus intercedes for us with God the Father.

Prayers of **thanksgiving** acknowledge and thank God for all he has given us. We express our gratitude to him for the good things in our lives.


The Holy Spirit is our Advocate, guiding and comforting us, strengthening us to know and live by the truth.

- The Holy Spirit, who strengthened the first disciples to spread Jesus' message and understand his truth, keeps the Church going, giving her life and energy and uniting us as one Body of Christ.
- We all experience difficulties and challenges, some that we must face alone. However, we are never truly alone because the Holy Spirit is with us, comforting, strengthening, and supporting us.
- The Holy Spirit guides the Church in her Sacred Tradition and her prayer. The Holy Spirit helps us pray at different times, in different ways, and in different circumstances.


People of Faith

Saint Rafqa (Rebecca), 1832–1914

Born in Lebanon as Boutrossieh Ar-Rayes, Rafqa felt a call to religious life at age fourteen and later became a nun. She joined the Order of Saint Anthony of the Maronites (Baladiya Order) in 1871 and took the name of Rafqa (Rebecca).

Blind and near the time of her death, Rafqa asked that her sight be restored for an hour so she could again see the face of her friend Mother

Superior Ursula Doumit. The hour of sight was granted. Miracles of healing were later recorded at Rafqa's grave. The Church celebrates her feast day on March 23.
