


## **Something More**

How do the body and the soul work together in God's plan?

We are given our bodies by God. We care for and nourish them by eating and drinking properly. We also care for our bodies by exercising and keeping our bodies strong. Souls are similar. Just as a body can be undernourished or weak, a soul can be malnourished and weak.

Everyone has a soul, a spiritual principle which God created in them. You cannot examine your soul like the parts of your body. But it is there, inside, individual, spiritual and everlasting. Your soul is an essential part of who you are—your body and soul together make you who you are.



In his letters to the people of Corinth, Saint Paul describes how the Holy Spirit resides within the body. He uses the image of a temple and applies it to our body and soul, as the **Temple of the Holy Spirit**.

## **Scripture**

"Do you not know that your body is a temple of the holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore, glorify God in your body."

1 Corinthians 6:19–20

Faithful people pay attention to their souls. Caring for and paying attention to your soul is the flip side of caring for and paying attention to your body. Care of your soul and care of your body are two sides of the same coin of nourishing yourself. In his *Theology of the Body*, Pope Saint John Paul II pointed out that our bodies and souls are united within us. Whatever we do with our bodies, we also do with our souls. That's why it is so important to care for our bodies and use them only as God intended.

You can't take care of the world around you unless you first take care of yourself. Nourishing and building your soul are important tasks if you are going to grow and mature.

#### The Temple in Jesus' Day


In Jesus' time, and for about forty years after his Crucifixion (before Paul's letter to the Corinthians was written), the Temple in Jerusalem was the main focus for Jewish religion. Paul was Jewish before he was baptized as a Christian.

The Temple was where devout Jews offered sacrifices to God. This was the third Temple to stand on this spot, which was a sign of

God's presence among his Chosen People. It was the place that symbolized their entire religious practice. It was so significant that every male Jew was required to visit the Temple once a year to make a sacrifice to God of a dove, a sheep, or an ox. This understanding of the Temple may have influenced Saint Paul when he wrote that each of us is a temple of the Holy Spirit meant to give glory to God. (See 1 Corinthians 6:19.)

#### Food for the Soul

#### What gifts does the Holy Spirit give us?

You need to eat right to feel right. The right kinds of food promote healthy growth in our bodies. Balanced meals include all the vitamins, minerals, and other nutrients our bodies need.

Our souls are nourished by God's grace. Grace comes to us in a variety of ways, most importantly in Baptism, the Eucharist, and the other Sacraments. Baptism is the gateway into the life of the Holy Spirit. In Baptism, we are set apart as belonging to Jesus Christ by being marked with a permanent spiritual seal called a **character**. This seal strengthens us to be Christ's witnesses in the world. Other Sacraments that confer a lasting seal are Confirmation and Holy Orders.

**character** a permanent, sacramental, spiritual seal that strengthens us to do God's work. A seal is given in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, or Holy Orders.

seals us with a special outpouring of the seven **Gifts of the Holy Spirit**, which give us guidance on how to live a holy life. Confirmation also deepens the grace of Baptism, and strengthens us to give witness to Christ in the world. The Gifts help us follow the guidance of the Holy Spirit and live the Christian life. They are referenced in Isaiah 11:1–5.

#### Fullness of the Spirit

Ever since our Baptism, we have received many gifts from God. We have been growing in faith, hope, and love. At Confirmation, we are again anointed with the Holy Spirit, who first entered our lives in Baptism. Through Confirmation, our relationship with God is strengthened and deepened.

Why does your relationship with God need to deepen? Because your world expands as you grow older. You will meet new people, and go beyond your family and household. Every day you will meet new challenges.

Therefore, you need the Holy Spirit and his gifts so that you can

- · connect on a deeper level to Jesus
- grow as a member of the Church
- become more involved with the activity, ministry, and mission of the Church
- be strengthened to witness to the faith by the things you say and do

In many ways, the Gifts of the Holy Spirit play an important role in maturing you as a Catholic. We all need to use these Gifts, just as we use other things we learn as we grow, for them to have a lasting impact on our lives. All Christians should strive to put into practice the example of Christ's life and his teaching. The Church also names twelve



ways in which a mature Christian shows that he or she is bearing fruit in the Spirit—the **Fruits of the Holy Spirit**. These qualities can be seen in us when we allow the Holy Spirit to work in our hearts (see Galatians 5:22–23).

Each person, cooperating with the Holy Spirit, shows Christian maturity in unique ways. These Fruits of the Holy Spirit all contribute to how you can grow as a person, and as a Catholic. For more on the Fruits of the Holy Spirit, see page 375 of the Our Catholic Tradition section of your book.

# A Temple Not Built by Human Hands

What plan does the Holy Spirit have for the Church?

The Church is truly a mystery, visible and spiritual at the same time. The Church is both a structured organization of members with a variety of roles, and the Body of Christ. The Church is a visible community and a spiritual one. This visible organization needs buildings and structures. Parish churches, along with schools, hospitals, monasteries, convents, shelters, centers, halls, and office buildings, make up the bulk of our buildings.

But just as we are more than our bodies, the Church is more than just the visible organization or her property.

#### What the Church Is

The Church is the Mystical Body of Christ. The Church unites all believers through the Holy Spirit into one holy people, with Christ as their head and themselves as the body, or members. The same Spirit unites members to one another as brothers and sisters in the faith.

The Holy Spirit is like a "soul" for the Church. In other words, the Mystical Body is not just a collection of human beings who happen to believe the same thing or belong to the same community. Together they are the Church because the Holy Spirit lives in them, giving them energy and life, helping them live as the People of God.

# **Scripture**

"For we are the temple of the living God; as God said:

'I will live in them and move among them, and I will be their God and they shall be my people... Our Sunday Visitor

and I will be a father to you, and you shall be sons and daughters to me,

says the Lord Almighty." 2 Corinthians 6:16-18

The Holy Spirit makes this promise real and builds up this true spiritual Temple, giving life to the Church and making her holy. He helps us relate to God in this world.

#### The Spirit Leads Us Where We Would Not Go

Everyone seeks to be comfortable, protected from the dangers of the world. No one wants to be hungry, homeless, and hurting. The Church, urged on by the Holy Spirit, follows Christ in his mission of outreach to those who are poor and in need. The Church goes to every part of the world where healing and hope are needed. The Holy Spirit leads us, and we go!

### IN SUMMARY Catholics Believe


God the Holy Spirit lives within each of us as individuals and in the Church as a community. We are Temples of the Holy Spirit, as is the Church.

# People of Faith

#### Blessed Cyprian Michael Iwene Tansi, 1903–1964

From the tropical rain forests of his native Nigeria to his final home at a monastery in England, Father Tansi shared the love of the Holy Spirit with everyone. Many of the villages in which Father Tansi preached didn't have churches. He taught the Word of God and labored alongside the villagers to build churches. Later he became a Trappist monk and took the name

Cyprian. During a visit to Nigeria in 1998, Pope Saint John Paul II praised his work and beatified him. The Church celebrates his feast day on January 20.
